	When information is shared appropriately, legally and in the best interests of the individual concerned, public services are able to work more effectively together and achieve better outcomes for their customers.

Contd/	Most people expect public services to share information and can be frustrated when it doesn't happen, especially when it doesn't happen between departments in the same organisation; sharing personal information means customers don't have to tell their story over and over again. Health and social care professionals are especially aware of the trust placed in them and will only share personal information where additional safeguarding measures are in place. As public servants we also have a duty to share some information without the consent of the individuals concerned. We do this in order to prevent or detect crime, or fraud or where we suspect children or vulnerable adults are at risk. And sadly, there are examples where the failure to share personal information appropriately has resulted in tragedy - Soham, Victoria Climbie, Peter Connolly.	
	The framework we have created contains information sharing principles, the difference between anonymised and personal data, when we need to get consent in relation to sharing personalised data to share data and how to record that consent.	
	The framework doesn't change any data sharing agreements or statutory guidance that we have in place, but it does collect all the principles and information into one place in order to help staff and services share information appropriately and consistently.	
	Supported by Portsmouth's Public Service Board and approved by the council's Corporate Governance Information Group, the Police, Probation Trust, Fire Service, the University of Portsmouth, Portsmouth's Clinical Commissioning Group, Portsmouth NHS Hospital NHS Trust and Solent NHS Trust.	
	We will make sure our staff and those who deliver services on our behalf follow the guidelines in this document and we will review and monitor its effectiveness on an annual basis.
