On the basis there is not a significant concentration of HMOs within the surrounding area, it is considered that an objection on the grounds of highways impacts, pressure on local infrastructure or impact on the character of the area could not be sustained. As the LPA has adopted policies in place to consider the impacts of HMO developments, it would be considered unreasonable not to progress applications that have been submitted for consideration. Failure to determine planning applications within statutory or agreed timescales would allow the applicant to appeal to the Planning Inspectorate against the non-determination of the application.
