2	St Jude	The Portsmouth City Council (Palmerston Road) (Pedestrian and Cycle Zone, One-Way Traffic and Amendments to Waiting Restrictions) (No.17) Order 2022	Marian Rehus (Senior Project Manager)	A new Traffic Regulation Order is proposed to introduce a Pedestrian & Cycle Zone in Palmerston Road (between Osborne Road and Auckland Road East), restricting motor vehicles except for loading 4am-11am and for access to premises. Travel would be one-way southbound, with contraflow-cycling, and the previous limited parking bays in Palmerston Road would be formally removed. The scheme also includes a loading bay in Villiers Road, close to the junction with Palmerston Road and removing one-way restrictions for Villiers Road.  The intention is to continue to limit vehicular access within the southern part of Palmerston Road, continuing some of the effects enabled by the temporary Covid-19 legislation. The latter was brought in by the government to provide space for social distancing and to encourage walking and cycling.  If you would like to view the proposed TRO, Statement of Reasons, plan and public proposal notice please contact street.projects@portsmouthcc.gov.uk	To undertake statutory 21-day consultation on the proposals detailed opposite, as soon as possible.  The response to the consultation will help to determine whether to implement the proposals or consider alternatives.  Any objections received to the intention to restrict vehicular access to premises after 7pm will trigger a public inquiry; this would not be a decision for a local authority Cabinet Member to make. Objections received to other aspects of the proposed TRO could be considered at T&T.
