The fourth application (19/01563/HOU) was returned by the Local Planning Authority to the Applicant as Invalid as it was not materially different to previous submissions. Two of the three refusals were appealed and the appeal was dismissed on both occasions. The most recently refused scheme (19/00265/HOU), sought permission for an almost identical front dormer, but with a low-pitched roof instead of the existing flat roof form. The cladding material has been renewed on-site with a somewhat better match to the roof, but otherwise the dormer has the same scale, position and design as always.	T Toposca Bedision
			The Inspector's concluded in the second appeal: 19/00265/HOU), "the appeal proposal would cause significant harm to the character and appearance of the host property and the wider surrounding area". The property is also the subject of an ongoing enforcement appeal (APP/Z1775/C/21/3280709 & APP/Z1775/C/21/3280723).	
			While it is noted there are some examples of approved front dormers within the road (nos. 37, 80 and 86) each application is determined on its own individual merits. A front dormer proposed at no. 62 was refused planning permission in 1998. Owing to the current application property's corner location it has increased prominence along the road (when compared to these other examples) with the dormer being viewed not just from the front but also the side. These points have been highlighted in each of the two previous appeal decisions. The front dormer at No.37 Battenberg Avenue was also raised to the inspector in both appeals, who was unconvinced that it could be considered an example of good design.	
			The Local Planning Authority has raised no concerns around the amenity impact of the development for individual neighbours. Work being finished to a high standard is the normal expectation for a development and does not in itself contribute towards an acceptable development. The lack of neighbour opposition is noted, however applications have to be considered against local and national policy and have regard any appeal decisions on the site). Developments within the local area (in this case at St Nicolas's Church and a nearby HMO) have no bearing on the acceptability of this application. Issues of possible removal (i.e. time and disturbance) are not material considerations and are a unfortunate by-product of retrospective applications. Application publicity was carried out in accordance with guidelines.
