A couple of queries were received about the proposals in Jubilee Avenue, and the residents were satisfied with the subsequent clarification; no objections. A bus company queried the proposed new loading bay in Commercial Road, and was satisfied with the subsequent clarification: no objections. A resident of Stride Avenue objects to the school zig zag operating times being increased to 8am-5pm (from 8am-4pm to replace the existing single yellow line) as he feels parking should be available during holidays and bank holidays. Unfortunately this is not possible as not everyone is aware of term times, and schools frequently have clubs and activities during holiday periods when children will be accessing the school. However the proposed extension to the times will be deleted as per the objection. This application seeks permission to increase the level of occupation following the conversion of the loft space to create two additional bedrooms (making a total of eight). Whilst the application makes reference to the construction of a rear dormer, this element of the development could be built as permitted development without the need for planning permission. Having regard to the current lawful use of the property, the proposal would not alter the balance of residential uses within the surrounding area. In recent appeals Planning Inspectors have taken the view that general activity associated with one additional person is not significant when compared to the existing lawful occupation of a property by up to six. It is considered that this same judgement would also apply to occupation by eight people (the rooms are of a size that occupation of property by more than 8 people would not be allowed under the provisions of the Housing Acts). Their objections can be summarised as follows: (a) Restricted physical and visual access; (b) Proposed trolley park too close to car parking spaces; (c) The loss of vehicle turning area would result in a risk to pedestrians and cyclists; (d) car park is inaccessible to cyclists; (e) No safe access for cyclists; (f) number of cycle parking spaces; and (g) No CCTV coverage of proposed cycle shelter. Whilst attempting to find a satisfactory location for two external display stands, the applicant proposes the relocation of the existing trolley storage bays and bicycle storage facilities. In visual terms, all elements of the proposal are considered to be acceptable and would not detract from the architectural or historic interest of 'The Friary' (Grade II listed) located just to the north. In respect of the proposed bicycle storage facilities, it should be noted that there are no planning conditions requiring the retention of the existing facilities or restricting the loss of the 'turning head' within the car park. Therefore, whilst it is accepted that the proposed arrangements would not be as convenient as the existing, it is considered that an objection on access, quantity or type of facilities could not be justified. However, conditions requiring the installation of safety bollards to protect cyclists whilst parking and the retention of the new bicycle storage facilities are proposed. Whilst not amounting to an objection on planning grounds, concerns in respect of the new layout and access arrangements have been addressed with the applicant.
