I also observed two males, both dressed in chefs' whites and a female, wearing an apron all of whom were engaged in food preparation. I attempted to engage with one of the males working at the stove, however Mr CHOI stated shouting at the staff, in a language unknown to me and as such the male was unresponsive. Mr CHOI continued to address me in a raised voice, saying that he could provide me with the names of the three persons, I responded to his request by asking him to write their names in my jotting notepad, which I evidence as
