		Proposal: that the council proceeds with the work described below at risk up to a maximum of £400,000 in the full expectation that it will be reimbursed by the government grant in 2015/16.	Transport & Environment Tel: 9284 1035/
		In order for the North Portsea Flood Defence Scheme to take advantage of the Environment Agency 'Project Acceleration and Growth' funding arrangements and secure Central Government funds of £6m in 2015/16, detailed design for the first phase of the scheme will have to commence prior to full approval of the Business Case. Maximum expenditure for this work could reach £400,000. This money is expected to be repaid during the financial year 2015/16, if approval is received. The flood defence work for North Portsea continues to rank highly against all other schemes on a national basis, and the Environment Agency supports this approach which will allow us to use Central Government money to commence construction in March 2015. Without this approach, it is possible that the scheme could be delayed by several years as well as having to comply with different funding criteria.	
		This would mean that Portsmouth City Council will be working at risk, or in advance of receiving the funds from the Environment Agency. However, this is deemed to be a very low risk. The Head of Finance and Section 151 Officer has been consulted and is content that this is a low risk. It is fully expected that grant funding will be forthcoming. If, in the unlikely event that the grant funding is not forthcoming, it should be noted that there is £230,000 of unspent coastal defence funding from the preparatory Coastal Defence schemes within the capital programme and a further £70,000 has been provided by the Coastal Partnership leaving a potential unfunded amount of £100,000.

		In consultation with the new Cabinet Member for Housing Councillor Wemyss, the Head of Housing and Property Services proposes to amend the Council Housing Allocations Policy to provide additional preference for persons with local connections, which aims to strengthen local communities and enhance individual residents' sense of identity as a citizen of Portsmouth.	
		The proposal seeks to give additional preference to Portsmouth residents who have been living in the city for 5 successive years or more, as opposed to the current policy that gives preference to those who have been living in the city for just 2 years or more.

The conservation area guidelines state that where replacement windows are proposed, they should match the appearance of the original windows including the pattern of glazing bars and the method of opening. Whilst wooden replacements would be desirable, replacement windows in UPVC is not actively discouraged. Therefore, given that the replacement windows are of an appropriate standard matching the style of the original windows and would create a degree of consistency across the front elevation of the building, it is considered that the proposal is acceptable and would preserve the character or appearance of the conservation area.
