		The CCS proposals aim to provide benefits for active travel and public transport and support Portsmouth's Local Transport Strategy and Local Cycling and Walking Infrastructure Plan (LCWIP). Reducing traffic in the area and adding controlled crossings will make it easier and safer for people to cross Station Street, while a widened Isambard Brunel Road carriageway will help keep buses running on time.		
		To improve this area of the city we are proposing to:		
		<ul> <li>Modify the road layout on Isambard Brunel Road to allow a two-way traffic flow.</li> <li>Replace the Station Square mini roundabout with a crossroads traffic light junction, with controlled pedestrian crossings at each of its arms.</li> <li>Add a new controlled pedestrian crossing on Isambard Brunel Road providing a safe crossing point between the Train Station and Guildhall Square.</li> </ul>

		One of the nine schemes within the SEHRT programme is City Centre North (CCN) improvements at Unicorn Road and Marketway junction. This is a popular route for many bus and coach services travelling in and out of Portsmouth city centre and to the Hard Interchange, connecting with train and ferry services. Marketway is located in an Air Quality Management Area (AQMA) and is within the Clean Air Zone boundary, as levels of NO2 in this area currently exceed legal limits.		
		The proposed improvements at Unicorn Road and Marketway junction support Portsmouth's Air Quality Local Plan and the Local Transport Strategy by easing congestion and improving walking and cycling in this area. This scheme introduces a new bus lane, so buses avoid getting caught in, and adding to, congestion in the city centre particularly along Marketway.		
		<ul> <li>To improve this area of the city we are proposing to:</li> <li>Make a new lane for buses and taxis between Cascades Approach and Unicorn Road.</li> <li>Route outbound buses through a new lane for buses and taxis between Charlotte Street and Commercial Road North, east of Eden Street.</li> <li>Create an in-bound bus lane at Cascades Approach to Unicorn Road.</li> <li>Install a new tiger crossing to the south of Unicorn Road (allowing people on foot and on bicycles to cross).</li> <li>Improve the landscaping in the area to make it greener and more pleasant.</li> </ul>

This route experiences congestion at peak times, especially in the morning. Lake Road is a key route for many bus services travelling in and out of the city, and forms part of a popular cycling route. The proposed improvements along Lake Road support Portsmouth's Local Transport Strategy and will provide benefits for all road users, offering safer walking and cycling routes while bus priority measures will ease congestion and will help keep buses running on time.
