1		<p>Quality - Care Homes rated Inadequate by the Care Quality Commission (CQC)</p> <p>The Guardian newspaper published an article, on 23rd March 2023, focused on English councils, and the NHS spending money for care home services that are judged 'requires improvement' or 'inadequate' by the CQC (the regulator responsible for inspecting services delivering personal care and nursing in England). Several councils were cited in the article as funding people in these services, including Portsmouth City Council.</p> <p>For services where, CQC, as the regulator believes there is 'risk to life and limb' a 'notice of decision' to remove the registration with immediate effect would be served, meaning that the service would need to cease providing care without notice, meaning that people would be supported to move. In most cases where the regulator believes there are risks to residents because of the care provided, services are given an opportunity to improve ahead of reinspection by the regulator, which is the case for the Portsmouth based service referred to in the article.</p> <p>Like many Local Authorities, Portsmouth do not place residents into services rated Inadequate. Where people are already being supported in a service that is rated inadequate, our social work teams undertake reviews to determine whether the needs of an individual can be met; the person is safe and do they want to stay living in the service. As a care home becomes a person's home, and friendships are formed with other people living in the home, very few people choose to move because of a change in rating and the Council does not have powers readily available to it to enforce such a move without consent.</p> <p>In Portsmouth, as part of Health and Care Portsmouth Partnership, Adult Social Care work with clinical teams in the NHS to offer support to care services to improve quality. Initially the support is focussed on safety, stabilising the service and then moves through to quality improvement and sustained improvement.</p> <p>This support ranges from advice, guidance, and signposting though to bespoke training, and is directed at a service level to support improvement, whereas other services are directed at individuals.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">/Cont'd ...</p>	<p>Debbie Young Head of Services, Adults' Quality & Performance Tel: 023 9284 1160</p>

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2		<p>Since October two Inadequate rated care homes hosted in the City have closed. The regulator and the Council independently had concerns about the quality of care and/or safety of people living in the service.
