## Review into school attendance with a focus on transitional Years 6 to 7

## Preface

The Education, Children and Young People Scrutiny Panel undertook a review into school attendance with a focus on transitional years 6-7. This topic was discussed with relevant officers and determined to be the most appropriate area for review. It was recognised that this topic had clear synergy with working groups as well as policy, protocol and strategy developments taking place by officers within the directorate.

The Covid pandemic has impacted the resilience of the entire educational environment. It was identified that this report should be the start of a process of small and purposeful scrutiny topics that are outcome focused. Within this time of academic recovery, the work of scrutiny has never been more important to ensure that any topic chosen complements, yet challenges, existing workstreams of the Children and Families Directorate.
