		On 12 March 2013, and as part of the school modernisation capital programme, Full Council approved a contingency for emergency schemes of £309,837 of which £250,037 still remains.	
		At Redwood Park School a leak has been identified from a damaged water pipe which could potentially cause damage to the foundations of the school. In addition to this, corrosion has been identified to the filtration pipes to the swimming pool. The total estimated cost of these works is £42,000. The school has agreed to contribute £8,590 leaving an amount of £33,410 to be funded from the Children & Education Capital Programme.	
		At Meredith Infant School the heating controls have failed and require urgent replacement. This work can be undertaken at a total cost of £16,000. The school has agreed to contribute £4,000 leaving a balance of £12,000 to be funded from the Children & Education Capital Programme.	
		At College Park Infant School the heating controls have also failed and require urgent replacement. The work can be undertaken at a total cost of £7,400. The school has agreed to contribute £1,850 leaving a balance of £5,550 to be funded from the Children & Education Capital Programme.	
		Approval is therefore sought to re-allocate £50,960 of the contingency for emergency schemes to support the above three schemes.

In 2007 the previous Government launched the Primary Capital Programme (PCP) with a commitment to long term investment in primary schools. Funding of £8.4m was allocated to Portsmouth of which £270,000 remains uncommitted.           On 19 July 2012 the Cabinet Member for Children & Education allocated £1,200,000 of this funding to increase the capacity and improve the condition of Goldsmith Infant School / Brambles Nursery. Additional funding has also been secured from the school and from the two year old place funding capital grant giving a total budget of £1,480,000. 		additional £209,000. Approval is therefore sought to re-allocate £209,000 of the uncommitted PCP grant to support the additional cost of works required at Goldsmith Infants/Brambles Nursery.

		<b>Proposal:</b> that £14,000 be allocated from the spend to save budget to fund the Windows 7 upgrade to the library Radio Frequency Identifications Devices (RFID).	Services Manager City Development & Cultural Services
		RFIDs are the self-service kiosks that record the issuing and discharging of library books and other items in all nine static libraries and the new mobile library vehicle. They also enable customers to make payments and interrogate their library accounts.	Tel: 9268 8058
		The introduction of these devices was achieved through a spend to save bid which was funded by the reduction of 7 FTE Library Assistants. Approximately 80 - 85% of all straight forward library transactions are now dealt with by the RFID kiosks. This has significantly reduced the pressure on frontline staff, which enabled a further reduction of 5FTE Library Assistants from city libraries. This was part of the 2014/15 Library budget saving.

3	(Cont'd)	The kiosks now require upgrading to Windows 7 at a cost of £14,000. This will bring them in line with IT upgrades across Portsmouth City Council. The existing technology in the kiosks will cease to be supported by PCC IS Department and the upgrade will improve the performance of the kiosks, considerably extending their life.	
		The original spend to save budget that funded the purchase and installation of the kiosks is still open and holds sufficient funds to cover the cost of the upgrade. This could be viewed as deviating from the original purpose, which was to purchase the devices Members approval is therefore sought for the sum of £14,000 to be allocated from the spend to save budget to fund the Windows 7 upgrade to the kiosks.	
		The proposal has been discussed and agreed with the Cabinet Member for Culture Leisure and Sport

Their concerns can be summarised as follows: (a) Lack of customer parking for local businesses including Venture Tower and Victory Business Centre; (b) existing parking problems within the area; and (c) Site should be used for resident's parking. Permission is sought for the change of use of the car park to car sales and the siting of an office. With the submission of amended drawings showing visual improvements to the site office and the provision of staff and customers spaces on-site, it is considered that the proposal is acceptable in principle. The City Council's Highways Engineer has confirmed that existing business permits have been transferred to the adjoining car park to the north and that the proposal is unlikely to have a significant impact on the surrounding highway network.
