The amendment to the parking restriction will facilitate space for vehicles to continue to turn out of Lakeside Avenue onto Hayling Avenue once the road-narrowing feature is in place.  A2: Dunbar Road. To provide a clear view for a formal School Crossing Patrol point, to ensure the safety of pupils at the highly congested site adjacent to Milton Primary School  B1: Tipner Road.
