With the above in mind and following data analysis, who is the policy, service, function, project or strategy going to benefit or have a detrimental effect on and how?	More frequent bus services or those running at more times of the day with more affordable fares offer benefits to all but in particular to those without access to a car - car ownership is below the national average in Portsmouth but in particular amongst older residents and teenagers, females and those on low income.
Will any of those groups be affected in a different way to others because of your policy, project, service, function, or strategy?	The policy will benefit all, both users and other residents, through improvements to congestion, air quality and health impacts. It will offer increased mobility to those without access to a car or on limited income.
If you are directly or indirectly discriminating, how are you going to mitigate the negative impact?	The policy does not directly or indirectly discriminate against any individual or group.
Who have you consulted with or are planning to consult with and what was/will be your consultation methodology?	An initial, predominantly online, residents' survey promoted by email, telephone, social media and press release which produced a response from 1,100 residents and 32 businesses. the 2023 door to door Travel Survey through a special edition of the PCC residents' magazine which produced 700 responses and ongoing passenger and on street survey through national organisation Transport Focus which so far this year has had 580 responses.

Improved bus services increase the opportunity to take part in social and community activities which will improve mental health. Greater use of public transport will improve air quality and reduce congestion, pollution and noise. Most bus journeys involve walking at either end of the journey which has its own health benefits.
How are you going to measure/check the impact of your proposal?	By monitoring take up of additional services and facilities and reaching out across the Council for other data sources.

Each bus can replace up to 50 cars so freeing up road space for active travel and reducing congestion thereby improving air quality. Improved bus services and more affordable fares will reduce the need for car use in Portsmouth.
How are you going to measure/check the impact of your proposal?	By monitoring use of bus services and journey times which measure the impact of congestion. Air quality is monitored through a separate programme.

Car ownership is lower in the older and younger age groups and those with low income. Improved bus services increase personal independence and access to daily activities. All buses now have a wheelchair space, priority seating and improved handrails. More affordable fares include discounts for those under 19 while Tap on Tap off, now available on First Solent services, allows passengers with bank cards or smart devices to travel easily without
	needing to know the fare or commit to period tickets in advance yet be sure of the best value fare.

Reduced use of the private car will reduce congestion and pollution improving the environment and sense of place whilst reducing detrimental effects on our built heritage. The benefits to health and wellbeing will improve the quality of life for residents and encourage visitors to stay longer and return more frequently.
How are you going to measure/check the impact of your proposal?	By monitoring bus passenger numbers and liaising with other parts of the Council on visitor numbers and attraction admissions.

Improved bus services and cheaper fares for those under 19 will improve access to employment, education and training. The 62 new zero emission electric buses entering service from March 2024 and the wider BSIP programme has encouraged local bus operator First Solent to establish a new -electric-ready bus depot and regional headquarters at Hilsea. This will provide new employment opportunities for local staff and skills training in operating and maintaining the latest electric commercial vehicles. the new skilled jobs will improve earnings opportunities.
How are you going to measure/check the impact of your proposal?	We will monitor the introduction of additional services, the electric buses and the new depot and headquarters, the number of passenger journeys being made and journey time lengths as a measure of congestion. We will rely on other Council departments for data on employment levels and earnings.

Increased bus use and shorter journey times will increase the employment opportunities and available workforce within a given travel time. It will also directly increase direct employment in providing the service and increase the number of customer opportunities for the retail and hospitality sectors. The introduction of 62 zero emission electric buses from March 2024 will increase new skills and training opportunities. The BSIP programme has given confidence to local bus operator, First Solent, to establish a new electric-ready depot and regional headquarters at Hilsea which will private local employment and electric vehicle skills training opportunities.
How are you going to measure/check the impact of your proposal?	We will monitor the introduction of additional services, the electric buses and the new depot and headquarters, the number of passenger journeys being made and journey time lengths as a measure of congestion. We will rely on other Council departments for data on employment levels and earnings, visitor numbers and local economic performance.
