		On 14 February 2014 the Cabinet Member for Education approved the allocation of £15,000 to remove asbestos lagging from the boiler house at Langstone Infant School. This work was completed at a cost of £2,400 leaving an underspend of £13,100.	
		At Westover Primary School there is an on-going problem with regard to water ingress due to the breaking down of the damp proof course within the parapet walling around the roof line. Unless this is addressed in the short term the situation is likely to get worse with the onset of winter and cause further damage to the school. The cost to rectify this issue (works, fees and contingency) has been estimated to be £11,000. The school has agreed to contribute 25% (£2,750) of the costs in line with the Council's current policy on school capital contributions for in-year urgent works, leaving a shortfall of £8,250 to be funded by the Council.	
		Approval is therefore sought to re-allocate £8,250 from the scheme at Langstone Infant School to fund the issues at Westover Primary School.

In addition, a petition containing the signatures of 30 named individuals (some of which had also submitted individual letters of representation) from 20 properties in Twyford Avenue and Stamshaw Road has been provided which claims to be in objection to the proposal. The objections can be summarised as follows: (a) Too many "multi-occupancy" buildings in the area (b) Parking; (c) Increase in noise and disturbance; (d) Increase in anti-social behaviour; (e) Increase in waste management issues; and (f) The property is not suitable for use as a HMO (too small). The applicant seeks a planning permission that will enable the use of the property to interchange between a Class C3 dwelling house and a Class 4 HMO where between three and six unrelated people share at least a kitchen and/or a bathroom. The lawful use of the property is currently Class C3 (dwelling house). Having regard to the aims and objectives of policy PCS20 and the Houses in Multiple Occupation (HMOs) SPD that seek to support mixed and balanced communities, the use of the property as a HMO would not result in an imbalance of such uses, falling well below the 10% threshold (1.9% if permission was granted). In addition it is considered that the proposal would not adversely affect the living conditions of the occupiers of the adjoining and nearby properties or detract from the prevailing family character of the surrounding area. It is considered that the level of occupation generally associated with the use of any given property as a Class C3 dwelling house occupied by either a single family or other groups living as a single household.
