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Please expand on the A lack of provision of sanitary bins in male toilets can impact your cause anxiety, stress and embarrassment for users. policy/proposal will Two surveys were conducted to gain insights from men have, and how you who are incontinent and from workplaces across the UK. propose to mitigate These were developed in partnership with men affected any negative impacts? by this issue, the British Toilet Association, the International Longevity Centre, Bladder Health UK, and Tackle Prostate Cancer. 1 in 25 men aged over 40 experiencing some form of urinary leakage every year and 1 in 20 men over 60 experiencing bowel incontinence. Census data 2021 indicates that 9.42% of the City's population are males over the age of 35, with a further 16.07% being males over 50 - just over 53,000 people meaning that a range between 383-817 males could need to access sanitary bins when using the toilet. Men with incontinence expressed they feel worried, stressed and anxious about the challenges they face when they're out in public and need to dispose of their sanitary waste. They' shared the mental and physical impact this has — resulting in them leaving their homes less often. This policy may help to ease some of that anxiety.
