2. Purpose

2.1 To note that the Director of Public Health has published her statutory Annual Report for 2023. The topic of this year's report is poverty and the cost of living crisis in Portsmouth. The Public Health Annual Report 2023 provides an updated evidence base to support the city's tackling poverty work and its response to the cost of living challenges facing many residents.

3. Information Requested

- 3.1 The first priority in PCC's Corporate Plan 2023/24 is that "we will work to support individuals and families struggling to make ends meet", while tackling poverty is one of the priorities in the Health and Wellbeing Strategy 2022-30. The PHAR will inform the efforts to address this vital work and designed for use by the council and its partners. This includes statutory and voluntary sector groups that make up the city's Tackling Poverty Steering Group, which reports in to the Health and Wellbeing Board and where this report was presented in September 2023.
- 3.2 The <u>full report</u> is available on the Joint Strategic Needs Assessment page at <u>Poverty</u> and cost of living - JSNA report - Portsmouth City Council. The <u>Executive Summary</u> at Appendix A is also published there. The report examines in more detail why poverty is a problem, how it has been made worse by the cost of living crisis which has put many more households in a position of financial stress or vulnerability, and what that means for communities in Portsmouth. It explores how the city council and its partners have responded and what has been tried in other areas. The report makes recommendations for how people across the system can work best to maintain a focus
