Background

- 1. Members at the meeting of the ECYP Scrutiny Panel at previous meetings have requested information which would enable the Panel to enhance its' scrutiny role of children's services.
- 2. Key City Council member (Leader and Lead Member for Children's Services) and officer roles (Chief Executive, Director of Children's Service and Head of Children's Social Care) in relation to children's services are prescribed by statutory guidance to ensure clarity of accountability.

Ofsted

 The Ofsted inspection of Safeguarding and Looked After Children in June/July 2014 highlighted that improvements could be made to the challenge and scrutiny. Recommendation 11 from Ofsted was to;

Ensure that elected members are properly trained and are given high quality and relevant information by officers. This will allow them to appropriately scrutinise and challenge the work of children's social care and act as effective champions for children who are looked after.

- 4. Inspectors observed that the scrutiny topics for this Panel were focussed on education, and concluded through a trawl of public reports on the Council's website there was insufficient appropriate scrutiny of children's services.
- 5. Inspectors were made aware of a number mechanisms for Elected Member scrutiny including;
 - Weekly briefings to the Cabinet Member for Children and Education (Lead Member for Children as set out in the statutory guidance).
 - Membership of Elected Members from all political parties on the Children's
 Trust Board
 - Participant observation on the Portsmouth Safeguarding Children Board by the Cabinet Member
 - Chairmanship of the Corporate Parenting Board by the Cabinet Member
 - Reports to Governance and Audit and Standards Committee

Proposed Way Forward

- 6. Below is the relevant excerpt from the post-inspection Improvement Plan that is due for submission to Ofsted in early-December 2014, and is subject to approval by the Children's Trust Board on the 18th November.
