Pupil Premium 2014 - 2015

The Pupil Premium was introduced in April 2011 and is allocated to schools to work with pupils who have been registered for free school meals at any point in the last six years (known as 'Ever 6 FSM'). The Government believe that the pupil premium, which is in addition to main school funding, is the best way to address any inequalities between pupils in receipt of free school meals and their peers. This funding is allocated to support pupils to achieve their full potential and tackle disadvantage. Schools also receive pupil premium funding for children who have been looked after continuously for more than six months, and children of service personnel.

Each school decides how their pupil premium funding is allocated to best support their pupils. However they will be held accountable for the effectiveness and impact of the funding. This year the DfE informed us that the pupil premium for Corpus Christi in 2015 will be £73,800.

The SLT and Governors closely monitor this grant, but it is the specific remit of the Pupil Premium Co-ordinator (alongside the Interventions Team) to track provision, monitor progress and report to the Head Teacher and Governors on an ongoing basis.

Our Mission

We believe that every child should be encouraged and supported to achieve the best standards of which he or she is capable, and through the careful spending of our pupil premium funding and additional support put in place by the Governors, we can provide the very best learning possible.

To ensure that the pupil premium funding is allocated fairly at Corpus Christi we aim to:

- Analyse pupils' needs to ensure early identification of any barriers to learning
- Regularly monitor pupils' progress and evaluate the effectiveness of interventions
- Allocate experienced and specialist teachers
- Provide enriching learning experiences
- Work closely with families to target support most effectively
- Ensure pupil premium pupils have priority for clubs
