1	Charles Dickens	THE PORTSMOUTH CITY COUNCIL (HOUSING SERVICE: PLYMOUTH STREET CAR PARK) (OFF-STREET PARKING PLACES) (NO.66) ORDER 2014	Chris Wotton (Housing Management) 023 9236 7699	Formal public consultation on the proposals took place between 27 November - 18 December 2014, relating to the operation of the parking area in Plymouth Street, by Ladywood House. Survey letters were hand-delivered to all flats in November 2013, asking if there were a problem with parking in Plymouth Street. Over 50% replied, and of these over 80% said there was a problem, and that they wanted some form of permit and patrol system. In response to individual concerns Housing Service staff visited around a dozen residents to answer any queries they may have had, and ensure they were happy their needs would be met. Three meetings were subsequently held at Ladywood House to discuss alternatives. From this the residents' committee agreed in June on the best way the scheme should operate, with permits being restricted to Ladywood House residents only, one per household. The residents committee insists that this scheme meets the needs of and is supported by the large majority of residents. In October Housing staff attended a drop-in session to answer any further questions about the scheme, and hand-delivered a letter to each flat advising how the scheme would work, and inviting applications for permits. We did intend to advertise other areas on this TRO but following pressure from the residents committee, who had been approached by many residents impatient for the scheme to begin, we asked for the TRO to be prepared separately.	That the Order is made as advertised and comes into operation once the legal process is complete (end of January 2015).

				The proposed scheme meets the needs of most of the residents, and does provide for those residents who have many visitors and carers: a household's permit is readily transferrable - it isn't restricted to one vehicle or one person or by time. Permits are cheaper than alternative schemes (just under £1 per week as opposed to the normal rate of £2.50pw). Elderly residents have been particularly in favour of the scheme as they can offer their family visitors the opportunity to park in the Plymouth St car park, whereas currently it is used for free by people driving into the city who then go to shop or work. One objection was received to the TRO consultation, which has been resolved directly with the resident by the Housing Service. REASON FOR THE ORDER To establish permit parking in Plymouth Street car park (owned by the Housing Service) and to enable enforcement by the council's Civil Enforcement Officers. This will allow the designated areas to be offered first to local residents at a low price, in accordance with Housing's policy of providing local parking where possible. Once local demand is satisfied the spaces will then be offered to other customers - non-residents, students and tourists - at a market rate.
