Approval is therefore sought to allocate £37,000 of the underspend on the Charles Dickens roof project to support the urgent works listed above.

l I	Central Southsea	Works at Goldsmith Infant School and Brambles Nursery Proposal: to re-allocate approved Education Capital Expenditure in order to complete the redevelopment of Goldsmith Infant School and Brambles Nursery. In 2007 the previous Government launched the Primary Capital Programme (PCP) with a commitment to long term investment in primary schools. Funding of £8.4m was allocated to Portsmouth of which £61,000 remains uncommitted. On 19 July 2012 the Cabinet Member for Children & Education allocated £1,200,000 of this funding to increase the capacity and improve the condition and suitability of Goldsmith Infant School and Brambles Nursery. A further £209,000 was allocated to this project via a MIS on 12 September 2014. Additional funding has also been secured from the school and from the two year old place funding capital grant giving a total budget of £1,962,000. However, following tender returns the final costs will be in excess of this budget. Another PCP project has recently been completed at Ark Ayrton Primary School finishing with an underspend of £62,000. Approval is therefore sought to allocate £61,000 of the uncommitted PCP grant and the £62,000 underspend on the Ark Ayrton PCP scheme in order to support the additional cost of works required at Goldsmith Infants School and Brambles Nursery. 17	Hilsea	Extra Care Development - Cancellation of Change to Contracted Tenure Arrangements An MIS item (Part 2) was issued in March 2014 advising Members that the Head of Adult Social Care and Head of Corporate Assets, Business and Standards were to apply their delegated authority to approve amendments to the development agreement with Housing and Care 21 for the provision of extra care accommodation in the City. This would record the provision of fifteen shared ownership apartments at Maritime House in lieu of all eighty apartments being for Affordable rent and extend PCC's nominations rights period at first sale from four weeks to twelve weeks. Officers of the Council supported Housing and Care 21's proposal to change the tenure arrangements to include shared ownership at Maritime House as it would have allowed extra care accommodation opportunities to a greater number of Portsmouth residents with care needs. The extension of time for nominations at first sale was related to the additional marketing time required for shared ownership type arrangements. Following a national review of their extra care housing stock by Housing and Care 21, they have now decided that shared ownership tenure would not be appropriate at Maritime House and, accordingly, no alteration to the Nominations Agreement is necessary. This decision is entirely the prerogative of Housing and Care 21 and, whilst it does reduce the offer of an additional tenure from the scheme, the overall number of affordable homes is not diminished and is positively endorsed by the Project Board.
