Planning permission was granted in November 2014 for the construction of a single-storey rear extension which incorporated an eastern elevation that broadly matched the proportions of an original rear projection it was to replace. This application for a minor material amendment seeks permission to increase the height of the eastern wall by 20cm from that previously approved.  The exact dimensions of the original rear projection at the dwelling are unclear. However, based on evidence held by the city council, it would appear that the proposed extension would remain similar in its height and bulk. Having regard to the presence of the original rear projection, the degree of separation provided by a narrow alleyway and the southerly orientation of rear gardens, it is considered that the amended proposal would not be sufficiently harmful to the living conditions of the adjoining occupiers to sustain a reason for refusal on amenity grounds.  Regard is also made to the provisions of the Town and Country Planning (General Permitted Development) (England) Order 2015 that would allow for the construction of an extension with a similar impact without the express permission of the LPA. 		This report fulfils the Ports obligation under the Port Marine Safety Code (PMSC) of keeping the Duty Holders advised of incidents in the Harbour that concern Portsmouth Commercial Port, which is the Competent Harbour Authority under the Pilotage Act of 1987.	Accountant Tel: 9285 5944
		The following Categories of incidents have been reported to Portsmouth Competent Harbour Authority (CHA), 1 January to 31 March 2015	
		"Engine/Mechanical Failure" On 13th February 2015, a cross channel ferry suffered a black out failure in the vicinity of the Nab Tower outbound. This caused the main engines to stop and the vessel started drifting. Tugs were summoned to assist her back to Spit Head Anchorage to enable her to complete repair works. It was subsequently discovered that water had contaminated the separators which fed the fuel line to the boiler, generators and main engines, causing the main engines to stop. The separators where built for Heavy Fuel Oil and the recent change over to Marine Gas Oil due to the introduction of the new sulphur regulations 1 <sup>st</sup> January created the problem.	
		"Interaction" On 26th February 2015, an inbound reefer vessel and an outbound cross channel ferry made a routine arranged pass inside the harbour. A tanker moored on the Oil Fuel Jetty parted one of her mooring ropes as the ferry passed close by. The Captain of the ferry was subsequently advised to avoid passing large vessels in the vicinity of the Oil Fuel Jetty when a tanker was berthed there.	
		"Heavy Contact with Berth" On 1 <sup>st</sup> March 2015, A cross channel ferry was caught out by the wind whilst approaching her berth. She subsequently landed heavily on the fenders of the CFP 3-4 berth dolphin. The fenders absorbed the impact but were damaged due to the intensity of the contact.	
		The Total number of reported incidents from 1 <sup>st</sup> January to 31 <sup>st</sup> March 2015 was 3.
