		<b>Proposal:</b> to re-allocate approved Education Capital Expenditure in order to install LED emergency lighting at Langstone Infant School	Commissioning Manager Tel: 9284 1712
		The school has a project to replace all of the old lighting at Langstone Infant School with new energy efficient LED lighting at a cost of £33,000. This is being funded through a SALIX loan to the school with a 'payback' of 3 years.	
		The Electrical Engineers have advised that it would make economic sense to also replace the emergency lighting at the same time with new LED lighting. To do this will cost an additional £11,000.	
		Approval is therefore sought to re-allocate £11,000 of uncommitted funding within the School Modernisation Programme 2015/16 in order to replace the emergency lighting at Langstone Infant School with new energy efficient LED lighting.

		On the 5 March 2015 the Cabinet Member for Children & Education approved the allocation of $\pounds$ 72,950 for the design and replacement of a defect boiler at Meon Infant School as part of the 2015/16 school modernisation programme. The total cost of the scheme was £85,000. The cost factors in a contribution of £12,050 from the school.	
		The engineers have advised that the second boiler is also in poor condition and should be replaced at the same time, together with a new Heat Exchanger and BMS controls. As a result, the total estimated cost will rise to £110,000. The costs also allow for the removal of asbestos.	
		Approval is therefore sought to re-allocate £25,000 of uncommitted funding within the School Modernisation Programme 2015/16 in order to replace the second boiler together with a new Heat Exchanger and BMS controls at Meon Infant School.
