				City Council's Reasons for the Order	
				Isambard Brunel Road: To extend the existing 20mph zone to the Winston Churchill Avenue roundabout, past the new main entrance to Charter Academy (secondary school). The zone will incorporate traffic calming measures and new school keep clear zig zag markings, to keep the area in front of the school entrance free of parked vehicles.	
				During the period 1-Apr-2010 and 31-Mar-2015, 13 collisions were recorded (1 serious), 10 of the 13 collisions occurred in the 30mph section of Isambard Brunel Road. In 2014 the school moved its main entrance from the 20mph limit Hyde Park Road to Isambard Brunel Road and also increased school pupil numbers by approximately 200. Funding has been allocated towards improving safety and lower the potential risk posed to pupils, to address local concerns.	
				Wimborne Road: To amend the stopping restriction (zig zags) so that it is effectively applied and is relevant to the school entrances, which have changed.	
				Kent Road (Junior School): To relocate the zig zags to cover the pedestrian access instead of the vehicular access; to ensure relevance.	
				Kent Road (Senior School): In conjunction with a new dedicated pedestrian entrance.
