8		New Coastal Defences at Milton Common	Claire Bartlett,
		On behalf of Portsmouth City Council, the Eastern Solent Coastal Partnership is delivering the second phase of the North Portsea Island Coastal Defence Scheme at Milton Common and Great Salterns Quay.	
		The wider North Portsea Island Coastal Flood and Erosion Risk Management (CFERM) Scheme is designed to reduce the risk of coastal flooding and erosion to over 4,700 homes and businesses and critical infrastructure in Portsmouth over the next 100 years.	
		The scheme, costing £58m to deliver, will offer a 1:500 year Standard of Protection once completed, and is one of the best standard of protection in the U.K., outside of London.	
		The work at Milton Common follows on from the ongoing coastal defence improvements a Anchorage Park. There will be a new rock revetment installed along the coastline. The revetment, or sloping structure, is designed to control erosion. Two earth embankments will be set back along the common, and will link in with high ground throughout the area to ensure a suitable level of flood defence is provided. The embankments will have a new gravel path along the top, which will protect the defences and maintain access throughout the common. You can find an artist impression of the new coastal defences overleaf.	
		This work will also include the removal of Great Salterns Quay. The quay is over 50 years old and has reached the end of its life and is continuing to deteriorate, with health and safety concerns. The removal of the quay will also allow the foreshore to return to natural mudflat to restore internationally protected habitat. We are legally required to provide this habitat due to impacts of the new coastal defences within the wider harbour.	/
		These works are subject to planning approval. A planning application will be submitted in October 2015.	ו
