The remainder of the ground floor would be subdivided to form four retail units using existing openings.  The Council has no planning control over the use of the majority of the ground floor as four shop units. Such a change of use is permitted under the provisions of the General Permitted Development Order. The proposed residential accommodation would comply with the nationally described floorspace standards, provide a satisfactory standard of living environment, and have an acceptable provision of cycle storage. Whilst the proposal would have one car parking space, having regard to the location of the site within a district centre and in close proximity to public transport facilities, it is considered that a car-free development would be justified.

		It is considered that the level of occupation generally associated with the use of any given property as a HMO (C4) is not materially different to the use of a property as a Class C3 dwellinghouse occupied by either a single family or other groups living as a single household. On that basis, it is considered that the grounds of objections could not be sustained.
		Separate legislation exists to deal with fire risk, noise/disturbance and rubbish although the provision/retention of suitable refuse/recyclables storage facilities can be controlled by condition.
